



2.2 The CCMA may respond to any enquiry in its absolute discretion and the bidder acknowledges that it will have no claim against the CCMA on the basis that its bid was disadvantaged by lack of information, or inability to resolve ambiguities.

3. Bid Validity Period

Responses to this RFQ received from bidders will be valid for a period of **90** days counted from the bid closing date.

4. Instructions on submission of Bids

5. Preparation of RFQ Response

5.1 All the documentation submitted in response to this RFQ must be in English.

All bidders must be registered on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) prior to submitting bid and include in their bid a copy of their Master Registration Number (Supplier Number) in order for CCMA to verify the bidder's tax status on CSD and other Governing compliances.

6. CCMA's Rights

- The CCMA is entitled to amend any bid conditions, bid validity period, RFQ specifications, or extend the bid closing date, all before the bid closing date. All bidders, to whom the RFQ documents have been issued and where the CCMA has record of such bidders, may be advised in writing of such amendments in good time and any such changes will be posted on the CCMA's website under the relevant tender information. All prospective bidders should therefore ensure that they visit the website regularly and before they submit their bid response to ensure that they are kept updated on any amendments in this regard.
- The CCMA reserves the right not to accept the lowest priced or any quote in part or in whole. The CCMA normally awards the contract to the bidder who proves to be fully capable of handling the contract and whose proposal is functionally acceptable and/or financially advantageous to the CCMA.
- 6.3 The CCMA reserves the right to award this bid as a whole or in part.
- The CCMA reserves the right to consider the guidelines and prescribed hourly remuneration rates for consultants as provided in the **National Treasury Instruction 03 of 2017/2018: Cost Containment Measures**, where relevant.

7. Undertakings by the Bidder

- 7.2 The bidder agrees that the offer contained in its bid shall remain binding upon him/her and receptive for acceptance by the CCMA during the bid validity period indicated in the RFQ and calculated from the bid closing hour and date such offer and its acceptance shall be subject to the terms and conditions contained in this RFQ document read with the bid.
- 7.3 The bidder furthermore confirms that he/she has satisfied himself/herself as to the correctness and validity of his/her bid response; that the price(s) and rate(s) quoted cover all the work/item(s) specified in the bid response documents; and that the price(s) and rate(s) cover all his/her obligations

- under a resulting contract for the services contemplated in this RFQ; and that he/she accepts that any mistakes regarding price(s) and calculations will be at his/her risk.
- 7.4 The successful bidder accepts full responsibility for the proper execution and fulfilment of all obligations and conditions devolving on him/her under the supply agreement and SLA to be concluded with CCMA, as the principal(s) liable for the due fulfilment of such contract.

1. BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1.1 BACKGROUND OF SERVICE OR GOODS REQUIRED

The Commission for Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration (CCMA) is an independent and autonomous organization that was established by the Labour Relations Act of 1995 (LRA) to deliver dispute prevention and resolution services to the people of South Africa. The core mandate of the CCMA, as one of the organizations charged with implementing the LRA, is derived from the purpose of the LRA which, amongst others, is to advance economic development, social justice, labour peace and the democratization of the workplace.

Twenty (20) CCMA Officials (inclusive of Commissioners) to be trained on Train the Trainer. The training will be held virtually from 05 – 08 September 2022 for four days.

The required service will enhance the facilitators with the necessary skills to facilitate training in a coherent manner using appropriate methodologies that promote open interaction to ensure learners/participants are active participants in their own learning.

2. OVERVIEW ON RFQ.

To provide facilitated and interactive virtual training to the CCMA officials.

The training and materials provided should be of high quality.

The training course will be for four **(04)** consecutive days, the **fourth** day is for portfolio building and final assessments.

The training will be provided to the CCMA officials, approximately **twenty (20)** participants.

Training will be delivered using the virtual platform.

Training will be held on 05 – 08 September 2022.

3. RFQ SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The successful service provider should have a proven track record of successful delivery of this service in other organizations. Proof needs to be delivered in the form of written confirmation and comments from other organizations.

- A high level of expertise is expected of all personnel dealing with this project. Proof of expertise, experience and Postgraduate qualifications needs to be submitted in the form of short resumes.
- ii. Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) principles shall apply, whereby submissions will be evaluated accordingly to the provisions of the Act.
- iii. Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status will be scored in accordance with the DTI Codes of Good Practice and bidders must submit their valid Tax Clearance Certificate and B-BBEE verification certificate, as issued by a SANAS accredited verification agency or Sworn Affidavit, with their submission, in order to be eligible for B-BBEE points.
- iv. The evaluation criteria will be on Quality/Functionality 100 points, Price for 80 points & B-BBEE 20 points.
- v. CCMA does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender and reserves the right to accept any tender or portion of a tender.
- vi. Submissions that are late, will not be accepted.
- vii. All quotations are to remain valid for a period of ninety days (90 days) from the closing date of the submission.

A detailed report compiled by the facilitator to be sent to the ETD Specialist which includes detailed information on the course and learner progress.

Certificates to be issued within thirty (30) days after the successful completion of the summative assessment.

Outline the main risks foreseen for this project and propose how they can be managed and mitigated.

The quotation should include a detailed project outline.

The service provider should provide a quotation indicating the number of days and contact time needed for the completion of the training/workshop which will be assessed upon completion of the training.

The service provider must submit a training report to ETD within 30 days.
