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SECTION 1

Introduction and Background

The Commission for Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration (CCMA) is an independent and autonomous organization that was established by the Labour Relations Act of 1995 (LRA) to deliver dispute prevention and resolution services to the people of South Africa. The core mandate of the CCMA, as one of the organisations charged with implementing the LRA, is derived from the purpose of the LRA which, amongst others, is to advance economic development, social justice, labour peace and the democratisation of the workplace.

The CCMA places a high standard on the well-being and safety of its employees and assets and stakeholders; and acknowledges that the costs involved in accidents, incidents, security risks and exposures affect the well-being of employees, productivity and integrity the organisation and its processes and also create a negative image with subsequent impact on users and stakeholders and is therefore committed to create a healthy and safe working environment for its employees, users and stakeholders.

The CCMA Gqeberha office requires bidders to provide proposals for maintenance and upkeep of existing biometric access control on first and second floors.

- 1.6 The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.
