SECTION 1: GENERAL CONDITIONS OF BID

It shall be kept confidential by the respondent and its officers, employees, agents and representatives. The respondent shall not disclose, publish, or advertise this RFP or related information to any third party without the prior written consent of CCMA.

- 1.2. Closing date for enquiries in relation to this RFP will be 20 September 2024 at 16:00.
- **1.3.** The enquiries will be consolidated, and CCMA will issue one response and such response will be posted, within two days after the last day of enquiries, onto the CCMA website (www.ccma.org.za) under tenders i.e. next to the same RFP document.
- 1.4. The CCMA may respond to any enquiry in its absolute discretion and the bidder acknowledges that it will have no claim against the CCMA on the basis that its bid was disadvantaged by lack of information, or inability to resolve ambiguities.

Bid Validity Period

Responses to this RFP received from bidders will be valid for a period of **120** days counted from the bid closing date.

Instructions on submission of Bids

Bids should be submitted in duplicate (2 hard copies) and one electronic copy (on USB) in PDF format all bound in a sealed envelope endorsed, CCMA/2024/04 (A)- ICT: Provisioning of a Web-Based Dispute Management System with Maintenance and Support for a period of 18 Months (Re-advertisement). The sealed envelope must be placed in the bid box at the Main Reception area of the CCMA National Office, 28 Harrison Street, JCI Building, 8th Floor, Johannesburg, 2001 by no later than 11:00 AM [Telkom time] on the 27 September 2024.

- 1.5. Bids must be submitted in the prescribed response format, herein reflected as **Response Format**.
- **1.6.** The bid closing date, bidder name and the return address must also be endorsed on the envelope.
- 1.7. If a courier service company is being used for delivery of the bid response, the bid description must be endorsed on the delivery note/courier packaging and the courier must ensure that documents are placed / deposited into the bid box found on the 8th floor Reception area, JCI Building, 28 Harrison Street, Johannesburg, 2001. The CCMA will not be held responsible for any delays where bid documents are handed to the CCMA Receptionist/ officials.
- 1.8. No bid response received by telegram, telex, email, facsimile or similar medium will be considered.
- 1.9. Where a bid response is not in the bid box at the time of the bid closing, such a bid document will be regarded as a late bid. It is the CCMA's policy not to consider late bids for tender evaluation.

Preparation of Bid Response

- **1.10.** All the documentation submitted in response to this RFP must be in English.
- **1.11.** The bidder is responsible for all the costs that it shall incur related to the preparation and submission of the bid document.
- 1.12. Bids submitted by bidders which are, or comprised of companies must be signed by a person or persons duly authorised thereto by a resolution of the applicable Board of Directors, a copy of which Resolution, duly certified, must be submitted with the bid.
- 1.13. The bidder should check the numbers of the pages of its bid to satisfy itself that none of their documents are missing or duplicated. No liability will be accepted by CCMA in regard to anything arising from the fact that pages/documents of a bid are missing or duplicated.
- **1.14.** A valid Tax Clearance Certificate with the tax compliance status PIN must be included in the bid response to verify bidders' tax compliance status.
- 1.15. All bidders must be registered on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) prior to submitting bids and include in their bid a copy of their Master Registration Number (Supplier Number) in order for CCMA to verify the bidder's tax status on CSD and other Governing compliances.

Supplier Performance Management

Supplier Performance Management is viewed by the CCMA as a critical component in ensuring value for money acquisition and good supplier / or service provider relations between the CCMA and all its suppliers.

The successful bidder shall, upon receipt of written notification of an award, be required to conclude a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the CCMA, which will form an integral part of the supply agreement. The SLA will serve as a tool to measure, monitor and assess the supplier 's performance and ensure effective delivery of service, quality and value-add to CCMA's business.

Supplier Development

The CCMA promotes enterprise development. In this regard, successful bidders may be required to mentor SMMEs and/ or Youth-Owned businesses. The implications of such arrangement will be subject to negotiations between the CCMA and the successful bidder.

CCMA's Rights

- 1.16. The CCMA is entitled to amend any bid conditions, bid validity period, RFP specifications, or extend the bid closing date, all before the bid closing date. All bidders, to whom the RFP documents have been issued and where the CCMA has record of such bidders, may be advised in writing of such amendments in good time and any such changes will be posted on the CCMA's website under the relevant tender information. All prospective bidders should therefore ensure that they visit the website regularly and before they submit their bid response to ensure that they are kept updated on any amendments in this regard.
- 1.17. The CCMA reserves the right not to accept the lowest priced bid or any bid in part or in whole. The CCMA normally awards the contract to the bidder who proves to be fully capable of handling the contract and whose bid is functionally acceptable and/or financially advantageous to the CCMA.
- **1.18.** The CCMA reserves the right to award this bid as a whole or in part.
- **1.19.** The CCMA will verify the submitted reference letters with the clients.
- 1.20. The CCMA reserves the right to consider the guidelines and prescribed hourly remuneration rates for consultants as provided in the National Treasury Instruction 03 of 2017/2018: Cost Containment Measures, where relevant.
- 1.21. The CCMA reserves the right to request all relevant information, agreements and other documents to verify information supplied in the bid response. The bidder hereby gives consent to the CCMA to conduct background checks on the bidding entity and any of its directors / trustees / shareholders / members.

Undertakings by the Bidder

- **1.22.** By submitting a bid in response to the RFP, the bidder will be taken to offer to render all or any of the services described in the bid response submitted by it to the CCMA on the terms and conditions and in accordance with the specifications stipulated in this RFP document.
- **1.23.** The bidder may be required to attend an interview should CCMA require such and the bidder shall be notified thereof in good time before the actual presentation date. Such interview may include a practical demonstration of understanding products or services as called for in this RFP.
- 1.24. The bidder agrees that the offer contained in its bid shall remain binding upon him/her and receptive for acceptance by the CCMA during the bid validity period indicated in the RFP and calculated from the bid closing hour and date such offer and its acceptance shall be subject to the terms and conditions contained in this RFP document read with the bid.
- 1.25. The bidder furthermore confirms that he/she has satisfied himself/herself as to the correctness and validity of his/her bid response; that the price(s) and rate(s) quoted cover all the work/item(s) specified in the bid response documents; and that the price(s) and rate(s) cover all his/her obligations under a resulting contract for the services contemplated in this RFP; and that he/she accepts that any mistakes regarding price(s) and calculations will be at his/her risk.
- 1.26. The successful bidder accepts full responsibility for the proper execution and fulfilment of all obligations and conditions devolving on him/her under the supply agreement and SLA to be concluded with CCMA, as the principal(s) liable for the due fulfilment of such contract.
- 1.27. The bidder accepts that all costs incurred in the preparation, presentation and demonstration of the solution offered by it shall be for the account of the bidder. Reasons for disqualification

SECTION 2: INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

2.1. Purpose

The CCMA invites proposals from competent, well-qualified and experienced bidders for the development and commissioning of a web-based Dispute Management System with maintenance and support. The contract is for a period of 18 months.

2.2. Project Background

As part of the digital transformation strategy coupled with the need to optimise electronic content management, CCMA invites proposals from competent, well-qualified, and prospective bidders who have been involved in systems that focus in the South African context on labour dispute management, namely conciliation and arbitration management for developing and commissioning a web-based Dispute Management System with maintenance and support for 18 months. The contract is for a period of 18 months which includes maintenance and support, the development, configurations, and integration with other systems. The web-based Dispute Management System will be hosted on the CCMA Azure cloud Tenant under the ccma.org.za domain. It should be accessible via mobile devices (e.g. iOS & Android), meaning that the system components will be designed to resize with any mobile platform for ease of interaction and then of course from traditional personal computing (PC) platforms, which includes both Windows and MAC environments.

2.3. Fully Integrated Digital Case Management and Disbursement Process

The concept of a fully integrated digital Case Management and Disbursement Process like the one below: Figure 1, from start to completion, be it the case is completed at Condonation, pre-Conciliation, Conciliation, Arbitration processes, etc. and the outcomes of each of these processes.



2.4. SCOPE OF WORK AND DELIVERABLES OVERVIEW

The system should be optimised to run on the Microsoft Azure cloud environment and must be accessible on mobile devices (e.g. iOS & Android), meaning that the system components will be designed to resize with any mobile platform for ease of interaction and then of course from traditional personal computing (PC) platforms, which includes both Windows and MAC environments.

The system should come with a capability to be used by the public to refer matters to the CCMA on an online basis, known as e-Referral, a Scheduling component (for Commissioners, Case Management Officers, CMOs and Interpreters), Awards Compiling and Processing and Commissioner & Interpreters Invoice uploading and processing and Bargaining Councils Invoices Component which will form the building blocks of the value chain of the system as per the below:

 The portal used by the public to refer matters to the CCMA on an online basis is known as the e-Referral (Online Web Portal) component.

- 2. Scheduling component for Commissioners, CMOs and Interpreters
- 3. Hearing process
- 4. Awards and rulings Component
- 5. Closure process
- 6. Post hearing process

2.4 .1 Summary of the e-Referral (Online Web Portal) component

CCMA requires an e-referral platform, an **online forms web portal** accessible via a web link published on the CCMA website, among other platforms. The platform will have a subsystem used by Bargaining Councils that follow the same workflow processes as the Primary system. The portal will expose web links to the below and enclosed CCMA physical referral forms, which need to be transitioned into online forms:

- 1. LRA Form 7.11 (Application for conciliation)
- 2. LRA Form 7.13 (Application for Arbitration)
- 3. Application for Condonation (unfair labour practice/unfair dismissal/unfair discrimination
- 4. Inclusive of all other referral forms (there are currently approximately 40 forms, including those mentioned above, utilised by the CCMA).

2.4.1.1 Scope of work for E-Referral (Online Web Portal) Component

- 1. Digitise the above forms to an online platform that the public can access, complete, and submit online by selecting the applicable form.
- 2. The parties should be able to register and create a profile as part of the onboarding process to the portal.
- 3. Allow for uploading of documents which can be done by both parties (Employer & User) as well as CMO in case the parties bring physical files.
- 4. Registration and login must have at least two-factor authentication.
- 5. The system should be integrated with active directory.
- 6. The forms should accommodate drop-down menus with minimum user input required from the public when completing the form with validations fields.
- 7. There should be online guidance on how to complete the forms.
- 8. Auto generate submission numbers as per the CCMA business rules to be used as reference numbers.

- 9. Auto-generate electronic versions of the forms in pdf from the online submissions.
- 10. Create and maintain a document repository for every submission.
- 11. Auto-send notifications via email or WhatsApp and SMS to the applicant, respondent, and appropriate CCMA branch recipients with the necessary attachments.
 - 12. Auto generate and send daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, and annual reports in Excel and PDF as per business requirements to authorised personnel at CCMA.
 - 13. Integration with the Case Management System (CMS) hosted on an Oracle Database environment.
 - 14. Develop an online assessment and integration module to be used by CCMA internal personnel and other authorised users from the CCMA.
 - 15. Seek Clarity from applicants on submissions via the assessment module.
 - 16. Receive updates and additional documents via the assessment module.
 - 17. Check for duplicate submissions and present them to the assessor for matching.
 - 18. Validate emails and confirm that notifications were sent to the parties as per the CCMA business rules.
 - 19. Transfer submissions across branches.
 - 20. Assign submissions to CMOs.
 - 21. Process all referral forms electronically.
 - 22. Map submission fields to the CCMA's CMS fields for integration.
 - 23. Interact with the CMS's oracle databases and have the ability to generate case numbers and create an audit trail for the CMS system.
 - 24. Automatically create cases in CCMA system and reference the appropriate submissions in the online platform.
 - 25. Develop an online platform admin module that will be accessed by authorised personnel in the CCMA.
 - 26. Create and maintain transactions, Roles, and Users for the online platform with integration to the CCMA active directory.
 - 27. Regular technical documentation updates and structured knowledge transfer.
 - 28. New development, changes, and enhancements.
 - 29. Provide Online Platform Training to identified CCMA personnel as directed by the CCMA.
 - 30. Assist with the On-boarding of Bargaining Councils on an as-and-when basis.

2.4.2 Summary of the Scheduling Component for Commissioners, CMOs and Interpreters

The Scheduling component being sought is a process of dispute resolution that will be conducted virtually and entails the initial filing of the dispute, the appointment of the Presiding Commissioner, and the

presentation of the evidentiary processes. The presentation of Oral hearings, the recording of the process, and the rendering of binding settlements, rulings, and awards.

The importance of digitising and automating organizational business process management practices throughout the document's life cycle (record). From creation, collaboration, and declaration, policy-driven retention, and finally, document disposal or archiving cannot be overstated.

2.4.2.1 Scope of work for the Scheduling Component

- 1. The system should allow Commissioners, Interpreters and Case Management Officers to register and be granted login credentials.
- 2. System should support multiple scheduling of cases at the same time by Case Management Officer.
- 3. The system should accommodate drop-down menus requiring minimum user input from the CMO when scheduling the case. Information should be pulled from various fields of the Case Management system.
- 4. All system-generated documents must automatically be uploaded to the e-casefile.
- 5. Allow the Commissioners and Interpreters to capture dates they'll be availing to CCMA.
- 6. Front-end component that would be designed as role-based, which means that if a Commissioner /Case Management Officer/Interpreter is logged in, the items that would be displayed would be customised to the needs of a Commissioner from CMS, for instance, it will show matters allocated to that Commissioner.
- 7. The system should be able to schedule MS Teams meetings and send meeting invitations to the affected parties; to send the notice with details of the hearing by means of a Meeting link and the recording should be part and parcel of the Case File without requiring technical know-how from the Commissioner.
- 8. The system should be able to record meetings.
- 9. The system should come with components for Online Attendance Register to be signed by parties and can be uploaded to be part of the e-file.
- 10. The system should be able to integrate with electronic signature solutions (e.g. Signiflow or other relevant systems).
- 11.A help functionality to assist users in navigating the Scheduling component.
- 12. The system should come with notification functionality, i.e., notify SCMO and CMO on the outcome of the matter and the next step if not settled, and reminders and escalations.

- 13. Functionality for users to rate our service should be built into the system.
- 14. The system should come with audit trails.
- 15. System should come with an Admin Module.

2.4.3 System should be able to generate scheduled and ad-hoc reports.

2.4.3.1 Summary of the Online hearing process.

The function will allow CMO's to schedule online hearings via the web sharing file contents and documents with the commissioner. Also allowing the commissioner and parties to be able to upload documents.

- 1. The system should allow registered users to upload documents and access the documents.
- 2. The system should have the ability to assign an interpreter to a matter based on language requirements which means that it must come with the ability to capture and update the interpreter's language skills set.
- 3. The system should auto-allocate a Commissioner and an Interpreter if one is needed, and the system should immediately reflect the date, Commissioner, and Interpreter allocated to a matter while allowing the CMO to make changes.
- 4. The system should allow CMOs to upload correspondence received from the parties for the commissioner's attention.
- 5. Commissioners must be able to send out completed documents (Settlement Agreements / Certificates) to parties, and the same must automatically be saved/uploaded onto the e-file.
- The system should come with notification functionality, i.e.,notify Senior Case Management Officer (SCMO) and CMO on the outcome of the matter and the next step if not settled, and reminders and escalations.

2.4.4 Summary of the Awards Component

Functionality is to be developed so that commissioners can peruse awards/rulings and make amendments/changes to documents.

2.4.4.1 Scope of work for awards component

- Once the Commissioner has completed the award, the system should be able to auto-allocate the matter for Perusals without limiting it to the regional or provincial Senior Commissioners (SC) but to anyone available at that level nationally.
- 2. The system should have workflows whereby an SC would receive the digital Case File together with the award. It would allow modifications and comments on the award to be made within the same

system.

3. The flow process should allow for the ratification /track changes of the award before it is issued to parties.

2.4.5 Summary of the closure process

The system should allow SCMO's and CMO's to close case with various outcomes such as settled and withdrawn, etc.

2.4.5.1 Scope of work for Closure process

- 1. Once the commissioner has finalized the hearing the commissioner should be able to upload the outcome of the case on the system for the CMO to process further
- 2. The system should allow to allocate/auto-allocate interpreters.
- 3. Various outcome options should be available enabling the CMO's to close the cases correctly with the desired outcome.
- 4. Functionality for part-time commissioners and part-time interpreters to submit claims online, including the option of uploading supporting documents.
- 5. The system should be able to integrate with other systems that can interpret awards from English to other official languages.

2.4.6 Summary of the Post Hearing process

The system should be able to process post hearing functions such as rescissions and various other processes and grant access to CMO's to be able to do so.

2.4.6.1 Scope of the post hearing process

- 1. Allow CMO'S to process rescissions, S142A applications and S143 applications.
- 2. To be able to process Review applications and upload all the documents for the Labour Court.

Interpretation

- Terms shown in *italics* vary for each bid. The details of each term for this bid are identified in the Bid Data. Terms shown in capital initials are defined terms in the appropriate conditions of contract.
- Any additional or amended requirements in the Bid Data, and additional requirements given in the Schedules in the *bid returnables* are deemed to be part of these Conditions of Bid.
- The Conditions of Bid and the Bid Data shall not form part of any contract arising from this invitation to bid.

Communicatio n

Each communication between the CCMA and a *bidder* shall be to or from CCMA's *Representative* only, and in a form that can be read, copied and recorded. Communication shall be in the English language. CCMA takes no responsibility for non-receipt of communications from or by a *bidder*.

CCMA's rights to accept or reject any bid

CCMA may accept or reject any variation, deviation, bid, or alternative bid, and may cancel the bid process and reject all bids at any time prior to the formation of a contract. General Conditions of Contract

- Definitions
- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6. "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13. "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at

- artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19. "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24. "Services" means those functional se
- 1.25. rvices ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.26. "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2. Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:

- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
- (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1. All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2. If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3. If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4. If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5. Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6. Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7. Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8. The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1. Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2. Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1. The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1. Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

- 13.1. The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
 - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2. Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- 14.1. As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1. The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3. The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5. If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such

remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1. The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2. The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3. Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4. Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17. Prices

17.1. Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Contract amendments

18.1. No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. Assignment

19.1. The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1. The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

- 21.3. No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.5. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and

- the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3. Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4. If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- 23.5. Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- 23.6. If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
 - the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7. If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1. When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

- 25.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2. If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1. The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2. If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

- 27.3. Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4. Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.
- 27.5. Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. Limitation of liability

- 28.1. Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
 - (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1. The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1. The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31. Notices

- 31.1. Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2. The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

- 32.1. A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2. A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.

32.3. No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme

33.1. The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34. Prohibition of Restrictive practices

- 34.1. In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).
- 34.2. If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.
- 34.3. If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.

- b) I/we furthermore agree that my/our personal information may be used for the lawful and reasonable purposes in as far as the CCMA (responsible party) must use my/our information in the performance of its public legal duty.
- c) I/we understand that my/our personal information may be disclosed to a third party in as far as the CCMA must fulfil its public legal duty.
- d) I/we furthermore understand that there are instances in terms of abovementioned Act where my express consent is not necessary to permit the processing of personal information, which may be related to litigation or when the information is publicly available.
